



INTRODUCING NEW DIRECTOR



Dr. Rentala Madhubala Director

Prof. R. Madhubala is an eminent, nationally and globally recognized academician-researcher-administrator. She has been a Professor in the School of Life Sciences at Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi for three decades, with a very strong track record both academically and administratively. She was awarded the AS Paintal Distinguished Scientist Chair of ICMR for five years till August 2022. Earlier, she was Dean of the School of Life Sciences, JNU, Director of HRDāC of UGC at JNU and Director of the Advanced Research Facility of JNU. She served in these key administrative positions for 6 years.

She has been conferred several prestigious awards and honors including the President of India's Visitor Award for research, the Rockefeller Career Award, USA, the Career Research Initiative Award by Welcome Trust, UK and the National Senior Women Bio-scientist Award for lifetime achievements by the Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of India. She was elected to The World Academy of Sciences (TWAS). She is a member of all the 4 major National Academies of Science - FNA, FNAMS, FNASC, F.A.SC. She has been an adjunct faculty at the Centre for Infectious Diseases, Seattle (aka Seattle Biomedical Research Institute) USA for 15 years while being a full-time faculty member at JNU. She was conferred a Visiting Professorship by the American Society of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene (ASTMH). She has extensive international training and research experience in infectious diseases with several global collaborations and projects with institutions in the USA, UK, Israel, Sweden, Canada, Italy, Russia, Switzerland, Germany, Japan and South Korea. She was principally responsible for managing international training programs in Global Infectious Diseases for six years in association with the University of Washington, Seattle USA, and Seattle Biomed supported by grants from NIH, USA.

Dr. Rentala Madhubala's research focus is Tropical diseases. Her major contributions are in Medical Biotechnology spanning Drug Development, the development of diagnostic biomarkers for drug resistance in clinical isolates, point-of-care devices and diagnostic assays for infectious diseases, vaccine development, high throughput immunological screening of vaccine candidates, and vaccine concept development. She has over 129 research publications in high-impact international journals and 32 research scholars obtained their Ph.D.s under her guidance.

"In today's globalised world, Public Health has become more important than ever before. With the reappearance of deadly pandemics, there is a clear need to look at Public Health holistically including raising public awareness of critical health concerns, raising capacity of healthcare workers and ensuring pandemic preparedness. In my new role as Director (i/c), I look forward to advancing IIPH's role and profile in all these areas while fostering a collaborative approach with Governments and all stakeholders." - R. 

CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT & EXPANSION UPDATES



The Indian Institute of Public Health Hyderabad, stands at the threshold of a transformative phase in its pursuit of academic brilliance and innovation. Anchored by its Academic and Laboratory Buildings, the Institute has been a crucible of learning, research, and community engagement. As it charts a path toward a dynamic future, it envisions the creation of a state-of-the-art campus sprawling across its 43 acres of land.

At the heart of the Institute's current infrastructure lies the Academic Building - a hub of knowledge dissemination and collaboration. This facility encompasses modern classrooms, administrative spaces facilitating seamless operations, a library, and a versatile multipurpose hall fostering interactions and events that shape minds and initiatives.

Complementing this academic nerve center is the Laboratory Building, home to advanced facilities such as the HiRapid Lab and Public Health Lab. These spaces serve as crucibles for scientific exploration and innovation, contributing significantly to the Institute's research endeavors and its commitment to public health advancement

In November 2023, significant progress was made toward the realization of the Centre for Infectious Disease at IIPHH campus. An architect has been identified and appointed to spearhead the design process for the campus and specifically for Phase I which includes the facility - Centre for Infectious Disease. The design phase for the Centre is currently underway, marking a crucial step towards creating a state-of-the-art facility tailored to meet the demands of cutting-edge research and response to infectious diseases.

Looking ahead, the Institute is gearing up for a ground-breaking ceremony slated to take place in March 2024. This symbolic event will mark the commencement of construction, representing a milestone in our journey towards establishing a hub dedicated to combating infectious diseases.

Anticipating the construction phase, once the ground-breaking occurs, the timeline for building completion spans approximately 12 to 14 months. This period will witness the transformation of plans and designs into a physical structure, culminating in the realization of the Centre for Infectious Diseases-a testament to our commitment to advancing research, innovation, and public health initiatives.

Brown University / CEO - Leap Design
(6th November 2023)

<u>Topic</u>
"Design in Public Health"



Andre Nougeira, the CEO of Leap Design and a distinguished Research Scientist at Brown University School of Public Health joined students, research staff and faculty at IIPH Hyderabad on 6th November 2023 for a guest lecture on Design in Public Health. Mr. Nogueira, as Cofounder of Design Laboratory at the Harvard University T.H. Chan School of Public Health and at Action Labs, IIT Institute of Design, shared his experiences in bringing design concepts to solve public health problems. He discussed how design evolved to solve specific organizational issues and helped bridge the innovation gap between what beneficiaries required and what public health provided. He further elaborated on using design to reframe solutions to better understand behavioral aspects of Public Health and contextualize and adapt public health programs.



Prof. George Davey Smith University of Bristol (4th December 2023)

<u>Topic</u>

"Triangulation of evidence in aetiological epidemiology: principles, prospects, limitations"

Students, Research staff, and Faculty of IIPH Hyderabad welcomed Dr. George Davey Smith, Director-MRC Integrative Epidemiology Unit and Professor of Clinical Epidemiology from the University of Bristol, Dept of Population Health Sciences for a guest lecture on "Triangulation of evidence in aetiological epidemiology: principles, prospects, limitations" as part of the Royal Society Yusuf Hamied Visiting Professorship award.

Dr. Smith, a pioneer in the use of germline genetic variants for investigating modifiable causes of disease ('Mendelian randomization'), discussed the importance of triangulation in Causal inference, and highlighted various strategies to incorporate triangulation techniques in developing research studies. He also shared his experiences from studies he has led, including the Avon Longitudinal Study of Parents and their Children (ALSPAC).

We are thrilled to announce the "Launch of Advanced Collaboration for Birth Defects and Developmental Disorders," on August 30, 2023, between the State health departments, Leading child health institutions and organizations, Industries, Media, UNICEF, Donors, and IIPH Hyderabad to pool resources, learning's, materials and provide a platform for sharing experience across various stakeholders to boost efforts towards the UNICEF global theme of "Survive and Thrive: Transforming care for every small and sick newborns."

The event's inaugural session was graced by the presence of key figures, including Nilima Prasad Divi from Divi's Foundation for Gifted Children, Prof. K Srinath Reddy (virtually), Honorary Distinguished Professor at PHFI, Dr. Srinivas Murki from NNF, Luigi D Aquino, Chief of Health at UNICEF ICO, Zelalem Birhanu Taffesse, CFO HFO, Kishore Mulpuri from BC Children's Hospital, University of British Columbia, among others.

The collaboration is envisioned to support the 5 states in southern India (Karnataka, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Kerala) to enhance new-born screening, prevention and management components of all birth defects and developmental disorders under the Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK), with special focus on developmental dysplasia of hip and autism spectrum disorders. Distinguished speakers from the states presented their experiences. Prominent institutions including the Institute of Child Health (Chennai), BMCRI (Karnataka), and noteworthy Civil Society Organizations such as NIPMR (Kerala) and APD Bangalore, also enriched the discourse by sharing their valuable experiences.

How to Give

- IIPH-H is eligible to receive CSR funding. All CSR contributions to IIPH-H have to be made toward Public Health Foundation of India, which is IIPH Hyderabad's sponsoring body.
- Individual Contributions made toward IIPH-H are used as general unrestricted funds across various facets of building the Institution or may be designated toward a cause that the donor identifies with. All donations within India (from individuals and corporations) get a 50% tax benefit under Section 80G.
